BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE:

The 116th Infantry, 29th Division, was organized during WW1. The 116th Infantry Band was mustered on June 23, 1916 and served on the Mexican border until March 2, 1917. The band arrived in France in June 1918 and remained there until May 28, 1919.
