BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE:

In 1717, a Lutheran minister named Anthony Jacob Henkel arrived in Philadelphia from Germany. The Henkel family has been very prominent in the Lutheran ministry in Virginia.

In 1806, Ambrose Henkel and his brother Solomon, started one of the first German language presses in the South. The press began as an amateur operation in the New Market home of their father, Paul, a prominent Lutheran minister. Many of the people living in the Valley of Virginia shared a German heritage, and the early Henkel materials were printed in German and then later in English. The Henkel Press eventually became an important source for Lutheran devotional material, newspapers, song books, and children's books. The press was always more than just a business venture, and the family believed that it was a way to preserve their culture, language, and religious beliefs.

The Henkel Memorial was produced by the Rev. Ammon Stapleton, D. D. and after his death, it was replaced by the publication titled *The Henckel Family Records*, which was produced by the Henckel Family Association, Elon O. Henkel, Editor.
